KEYNOTE SPEAKER



Shannon L. Meeks, MD

Pediatric Hematologist/Oncologist, Program Medical Director of Hemostasis/Thrombosis, Aflac Cancer & Blood Disorders Center Children's Healthcare of Atlanta Professor of Pediatrics, Emory University School of Medicine Dr. Meeks is a Professor of Pediatrics, Division of Hematology/Oncology, Emory School of Medicine and the Program Director for Hemostasis/Thrombosis within the Aflac Cancer and Blood Disorders of Children's Healthcare of Atlanta. Dr. Meeks has a clinical, translational, and basic science research interest in the immune response to factor VIII in hemophilia A.

Dr. Meeks graduated with a B.S. in Mathematics from Duke University where she was selected for Phi Beta Kappa. She received her M.D. from The University of Mississippi School of Medicine where she was selected for Alpha Omega Alpha. She did her general pediatrics training at the University of Virginia before coming to Emory University for her fellowship in Pediatric Hematology/ Oncology.

Dr. Meeks' research focuses on the B-cell response to the factor VIII protein. Her NIH funded lab made key observations linking the epitopes recognized by anti-factor VIII antibodies and the response to treatment. She also is investigating the mechanisms underlying the initial immune response to factor VIII. She currently leads the administrative core for the NHLBI U54 Centers to Investigate the Factor VIII Immune Response to factor VIII.

In addition to her local roles, Dr. Meeks holds or has held many roles in her field on the national and international level. She was the "Theme Leader for Hemophilia and Rare Bleeding Disorders" at the recent 2021 International Society on Thrombosis and Haemostasis Annual Meeting

and finished her term as Chair of the Scientific Committee on Hemostasis of the American Society of Hematology in 2020. She is currently on the Medical and Scientific Advisory Board of the National Hemophilia Foundation and is President-Elect of the Hemostasis and Thrombosis Research Society.
